

## More than just a rehoming centre

RSPCA Cornwall branch was set up in 1996 after four small RSPCA branches pooled together to become a new registered charity and rehoming centre. The branch is not funded by the RSPCA, instead, we rely on local donations to keep our doors open. We work closely with local inspectors by helping to rehome animals that are part of cruelty investigations, but inspectors are not tasked or paid for by the Cornwall Branch. A lot has changed in 26 years, and right now, we are more dedicated than ever to helping those who are most in need.



Regardless if an animal is old, sick or has behavioural needs, once they come through our doors, they get given every chance of a new life. We mostly see unwanted and stray animals at our centre but we also see an alarming number of animals who are part of neglect or cruelty cases. We rehome hundreds of animals every year, some are more difficult to rehome than others due to their history, but we never lose hope that there's a home for every animal.





We Educate

Animals are at the heart of everything we do, but we also focus on our community and how we can support people to hopefully avoid animals being mistreated and neglected in the first place. We have a dedicated Animal Welfare Officer for our branch who supports our community by offering advice, education and financial support to those who are struggling with their pets. We also have a small Education Team who are working with schools, colleges and even youth offenders to try and promote a kinder generation to all animals.



Our devoted team is vital to the rehabilitation and rehoming of the animals that come into our care. Our staff and volunteers come from all walks of life and treat our animals like their own. By loving and respecting them they create lasting bonds and give our animals the best possible chance of finding their forever family.





We are like every other rescue centre in Cornwall; we have vet bills, energy bills and the rising cost of living means that we are supporting our community more than ever, which all comes at a cost to our branch. We have lots of ways in which the public can support our branch, from businesses like The Little Cornish Pantry who have offered us Corporate Sponsorship, having a stall at one of our fundraising events or
